MY QUIVER PRAYER TRAINING EXPERIENCE

From the very moment I was notified about the Quiver Prayer Training, I was very excited and eagerly anticipated the date. My excitement was largely due to the fact that I desired to move to a deeper level of prayer and, particularly, because of the calibre of woman that Rev. Jennifer Wallace is. I have had the opportunity of observing Rev. Wallace in several of the Women In Tune meetings and the one thing which has always struck me is that she is a praying woman of God. She continuously demonstrates this through praying for the nations, including the UK.

Well, Saturday 7th September arrived and I made my way to the Cornerstone Church in Leyton. Having just completed our church's major conference of the year, I was feeling rather tired; but was determined not to let anything hinder my attendance. And I was not disappointed.

There were about 20 women in attendance and Rev. Wallace took us through key scriptures about knowing who we are in Christ. Without the appropriate truth about who we become once we are born again, it would be impossible to pray effectively. We must approach God with confidence, knowing that we are accepted in the beloved; there-

fore He will hear us and answer our prayers.

Following on from that teaching we began to review the different types of prayer we can employ as children of God. It is important to note that God in His infinite wisdom has given us various prayer types we can use – depending on the issue we are praying about. Therefore, it is imperative that we know what these are so we can pray appropriately on all occasions.

The various types of prayer we studied included: Prayer of Supplication, Prayer of Faith, Prayer of Agreement, Worship, Praise & Thanksgiving, Prevailing Prayer, Intercession and Praying in Tongues. Each type of prayer was expounded on in detail, giving personal examples where necessary.

The group was then asked to undertake an exercise, which was taken from Daniel 9:1-23. We reflected on and discussed how long Daniel's prayer was, what type(s) of prayer he utilised and the lessons we could learn. A key point of this exercise to note was that Daniel received an answer to his prayer almost instantaneously.

However; a second exercise, again from Daniel 10:1-14; showed that this time the length and types of prayers differed from the first exercise. Daniel did not immediately receive an answer to his prayer this time due to a spiritual battle taking place which Daniel was unaware of. In both instances God answered immediately, however, on the second occasion, the answer was delayed due to spiritual warfare. The great lesson from this exercise was to always pray and never give up

until we receive the answer from heaven.

We subsequently studied the armour which we, as Christians, are to utilise in this spiritual fight against principalities; powers, rulers of the dark age and spiritual hosts of wickedness in heavenly places. Rev. Jennifer stressed the fact that we are never to fight against human beings; but against the evil spirits that seek to control and use people.

We learnt that it is absolutely imperative to constantly have on (develop and grow in) the armour our God has graciously provided us, to enable us withstand all the devil's attacks. These are: Belt of Truth, Breastplate of Righteousness, Shoes made of the Gospel of Peace, Shield of Faith, Helmet of Salvation and the Sword of the Spirit (The Word). All these work together to ensure that we continue to hold steadfastly to the Word of God and trust that it will be fulfilled in our lives.

Finally, we studied about the spiritual weapons and tools available to us which are effective in maintaining our relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ and also to enable us take our stand to pray effectively. These were namely: The Blood of Jesus, Our Authority in Christ, The Word of God, Binding and Loosing, Praise and Worship, The Holy Spirit and His Gifts.

Rev. Jennifer concluded the prayer session by stating that we that we can never be effective, fervent and prevailing in prayer without love. Love and compassion for the people we are praying and warring for releases the power of God to work on their behalf. The love of God compels us to continue steadfastly in prayer for others. We can continue to pray for people we may not even like. Love takes away any fear. Jesus Christ stands and prevails as our Model Intercessor because of His love for humanity. He went about doing good and made an impacting difference because He loved us and had compassion on the lost and hurting people of the world. We are also to emulate this nature.

I thoroughly enjoyed the Quiver Prayer Training, but, sadly it had to end. The sessions were extremely informative and insightful, and I am already looking forward to Part Two, which will, hopefully include some practical applications of prayer. ♦
